On 25th of April 2015, Nepal was struck by a 7.8 magnitude earthquake; this was followed by another 7.3 magnitude earthquake just over a fortnight later; since then there were over 500 aftershocks up to 5.5 magnitude. Over 9,600 people were killed and millions have been affected.

Unfortunately, the most part of donated money is still blocked by the government, which means that the reconstruction is slow.

Two years after the earthquake, the Nepalese Economy is recovering day by day. Currently it has 24 hours of electricity, and more tourists. In addition, there is a current large project in Nepal, the «Melamchi Water Supply». This Project aims to alleviate the chronic water scarcity in the Kathmandu Valley and about 170 million liters of fresh water conduct over one 27.6 km long tunnel from the Melamchi River in the Sindhupalchowk district to the Kathmandu Valley.



Melamchi Water Supply Project

On an Altitude of about 1400 m, about 12 km northeast the city of Kathmandu, a water treatment plant is then distributing the treated water by the simple principle of gravity. The project started in 2001 and is scheduled to be completed by end of December 2017.

PUKAR COLLECTION supports still the SITU-School project in Kathmandu locally.

Renovation work was carried out such as: leaking roof, carpet, wall painting, exterior floor, tables and chairs, etc.
