On 25th of April 2015, Nepal was struck by a 7.8 magnitude earthquake; this was followed by another 7.3 magnitude earthquake just over a fortnight later; since then there were over 500 aftershocks up to 5.5 magnitude. Over 9,600 people were killed and millions have been affected.

Unfortunately, the most part of donated money is still blocked by the government, which means that the reconstruction is slow.

Four years after the earthquake, the Nepalese economy continues to recover day after day. However, more than 1,000 young Nepali people still leave the rural areas every day. Three major projects in Nepal are currently: the new airport "Gautam Buddha International Airport" in Lumbini, which will carry out the first test flights in autumn of 2019, the "Melamchi Project" which will supply the people in the Kathmandu valley

with drinking water in the future and the new "Pokhara International Airport", which should open in 2020.
